In U. S. Geological Survey Bulletin 574 is the following:

"The Ajax Mine was not visited by the writer, but deserves mention begause it has been productive recently. It is near the head of Lake Creek, about 15 miles west of Jackson, or 50 miles west of Apex, on the Montana side of the Continental Divide. It is reported to have a strong quartz vein carrying argentiferous galena in slates. It was equipped with a 10-stamp mill and concentrator in 1905."

Bulletin 574 was published in 1914.

The mining district in which the Ajax Mine is, is now known as the Ajax district.

"Ajax District - A small quantity of lead ore containing gold and silver and a little copper was produced from one property in 1916." Mineral Resources of the U. S., 1916.
