Name: Choteau Titaniferous Magnetite

Location: Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, and 7, T. 25N., R. 5 and 6 E

The choteau deposit was discovered during the war. This is a "beach deposit" of Titaniferous magnetite. Extensive reports in 1930 by U.S. Bureau of Mines and 1914 by the U.S. Geological Survey.

The tonage is probamatical but undoubtedly large because of widespread occurance. Doubtful economically at present outing. To presence of considerable titanium which reaches 7% in high grade samples and because of relatively low iron content.
