

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

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Preface

Each year the Bureau Staff Field Agent visits many mining properties in Montana under the Title III Aid to Small Miners Program and the long-established Bureau Small Mines Program. With the tremendously accelerated mineral activities in the State, however, it is impossible to visit all properties during the year, and therefore information is requested by mail from mine operators and owners relating to their mining activities. The responses to this canvassing and to personal interviews are then compiled and published annually in the Directory of Montana Mining Enterprises.

Mining enterprises are listed, by counties, either under *Metal Mines, Nonmetal Mines, Pits and Quarries* or *Coal Mines*. Within the counties, the properties are listed alphabetically, and contain the type of ore or mineral produced; mining district and location of the property based on legal subdivisions of land survey; owners' and operators' names and addresses; mill capacity; and the number of employees. The yearly status is also outlined, i.e., whether the property produced ore during the year; is still producing; developed ore without producing; did exploration work; or remained totally inactive. To facilitate use of the Directory, an index of mines, mine owners and operators is included at the back. Also included is a list entitled *Major Montana Exploration Projects*.

The map in the back pocket includes township and range lines to facilitate locating the area in which a mine or group of claims is located. Also, the Directory entries include the mining district index number in [brackets], which will allow one quickly to locate the district on the map.

The Directory contains a supplemental list of mines that have previously been listed as active but have been inactive over three continuous years. Mines inactive for a period of six consecutive years have been dropped entirely from the Directory.

The compiler wishes to thank the many Montana mine owners and operators for allowing information on their activities to be published. Every effort has been made to publish exact and complete information. The fact that a property is listed in the Directory, however, is not to be regarded as an endorsement of the property by the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology. Conversely, if a property is omitted from the Directory, the omission is not to be taken as questioning its value or potential. Such omissions are known to occur, but most are traceable to failure by the last known operator to respond to repeated requests for necessary information. Nevertheless, in most cases, the missing data have been supplied from the best sources available.

For their contributions to the Directory, special acknowledgements are due H. R. Babitzke, U.S. Bureau of Mines, who provided the *Foreword* on the mineral industry of Montana in 1983, and to Henry G. McClernan, who contributed the section on gold deposits of the Big Belt Mountains. The feature on the Big Belt Mountains is the fourth of such articles on selected mining areas within the State, and we hope to continue these profiles in forthcoming directories.

Foreword

The estimated value of nonfuel mineral production in Montana for 1983 was \$240 million, a decrease of 10 percent from that recorded in 1982, according to the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. The most significant loss was in copper production, although a substantial gain was noted in the production of silver. The metallics accounted for 65 percent of the total production value for the year.

After a century of mining, the Anaconda Minerals Company suspended operations in Butte, a suspension that is expected to last until copper prices are increased drastically. ASARCO Inc.'s Troy mine near Libby produced at capacity in 1983, making it the nation's largest silver producer. Placer Amex Inc. began production in February at its Golden Sunlight mine near Whitehall; the mine reportedly will produce about 72,000 ounces of gold annually over a projected life of 13 years. Zortman and Landusky Mining, Inc. continued to improve its two gold-mining operations in Phillips County, with new recovery plants and leach-pad modifications. U.S. Antimony Corporation produced at less than capacity, and the Black Pine Mining Company produced gold and silver northwest of Philipsburg, but shelved plans for new mill construction. Companies announcing plans for gold and silver mining operations within the next few years included Homestake Mining Company near Jardine, CoCa Mines, Inc. near Polson, and Resources American, Inc. near Norris.

Exploration and development continued at a high rate. Anaconda Minerals signed a joint-venture agreement with Stillwater PGM Resources for continued development of the Stillwater platinum-palladium deposit. ASARCO and U.S. Borax and Chemical Corporation continued to explore the Chicago Peak area in the Cabinet Mountains; the deposits could develop into a major silver-metals producing area. Other companies known to be exploring for precious metals in western Montana were the St. Joe Lead Company, Cominco American, Inc., Exxon Minerals Company, Coeur Explorations, Inc., Climax Molybdenum Company, Meridian Land and Minerals Company, Amax Exploration, Inc., and Noranda Exploration, Inc.

ARCO Aluminum Company, after reducing production at the start of the year to 40 percent of capacity at its Columbia Falls plant, returned to 95 percent of capacity at year-end when the plant's fifth potline was reenergized.

Production continued at most of the industrial-mineral sites. The Elk Creek barite mine was reopened and producing, but at less than its previous capacity. Despite falling demand for gypsum for the wallboard industry, mining continued on U.S. Gypsum properties near Lewistown. Cyprus Industrial Minerals Company began construction of an expanded sorting facility at its Yellowstone talc mine. Most exploration for industrial minerals was being undertaken by companies currently mining for the same minerals within the State.

Gold Deposits of the Big Belt Mountains by Henry G. McClernan

Introduction




Figure 1-Location map.

The Big Belt Mountains, the prominent range east of Helena and Canyon Ferry Lake (Figure 1), yielded significant amounts of placer gold in the early days of Montana's history. Except for some production from the Golden Messenger mine in the north end of the range, however, gold mining has been relatively dormant in recent years.

History

Pardee and Schrader (1933) described Confederate Gulch on the west side of the Big Belt Mountains as . . . one of the three or four outstanding discoveries of the goldrush period in Montana. Although less extensive than Alder Gulch and Last Chance Gulch, it exceeded them in richness. . . Confederate Gulch was discovered in 1864 (Pardee and Schrader, 1933), and the bulk of the placer production from the range was made before the turn of the century. The boom times in Confederate Gulch, when pounds of gold rather than ounces were being mined, lasted from 1866 to 1869. After 1869 placer mining activity declined rapidly because the richest gravel deposits were exhausted. Total production from Confederate Gulch and its tributaries has been estimated (Pardee and Schrader, 1933) at between \$10,000,000 (285,714; 483,793) and \$30,000,000 (857,143; 1,451,379), with the most probable figure being about \$12,000,000 (342,857; 580,522). [Figures in parentheses are ounces of gold at \$35/oz and \$20.67/oz, respectively, during the period of mining in the area.] This would be a yield of about \$100 (2.9; 4.8) per lineal foot of gulch. The early work in the mountainous part of the gulch generated a large amount of tailings material that was carried to the mouth of the drainage by spring floods and thus buried any placer deposits that may exist downstream on the lower flood plain.

The other gulches on the west side of the mountains were worked in the same era. Placer deposits in York Gulch and Trout Creek were discovered in 1864 and first mined by drifting under thick overburden. Most of the placer mining occurred in York Gulch before 1874 although some reworking by hydraulic operations was done from 1888 to 1891 by the Trout Creek Mining Company. Pardee and Schrader (1933) estimated that \$400,000 (11,429; 19,352) in gold was produced from York Gulch. Cave Gulch placer deposits were discovered in 1866, and mining ceased about 1880 after producing about \$500,000. In Magpie Gulch early placer mining was done by drifting below thick overburden, but later, during the period 1911-1914, about half a mile of the creek was dredged. Total production from Magpie Gulch placers was estimated (Pardee and Schrader, 1933) to be about \$280,000 (8,000; 13,546). Avalanche Gulch production was from a high-level terrace along the north side of the creek, but no estimates of the production are available. White Gulch, the next major drainage north of Confederate Gulch, was mined sporadically for about 20 years, beginning about 1865, and produced \$1,000,000 (28,571; 48,379) to \$1,500,000 (42,857; 72,569) (Pardee and Schrader, 1933).

From Canyon Ferry Dam downstream along the Missouri River, a number of terrace deposits have yielded placer gold. Locations of these deposits can be found in a recent

report by McClernan (1983, Figure 30). Although the Tertiary and younger stratigraphy has not been mapped in detail, most geologists would agree that the source of the gold in these deposits is along the west flank of the mountains. French Bar was probably the richest of these terraces, having produced about \$1,500,000, and Spokane Bar was next in production at about \$550,000 (Pardee and Schrader, 1933). The other terraces, El Dorado, American, Gruel's, Ming's and Ruby, collectively produced about \$100,000. In addition to gold, these deposits have produced sapphires.

Gold was also produced from placers on the east flank of the Big Belt Mountains, most notably from the upper reaches of Camas Creek and its tributaries, Atlanta Creek, Elk Creek, Thomas Creek and Benton Gulch. The upper drainage of Thompson Gulch also contains placer operations. Very little is known about these operations except what can be learned from examining the workings. Thus it is inferred that the work on Atlanta Gulch was done by a dredge or trommel with a stacker.

The Golden Messenger mine is the only large lode gold mine in the Big Belt Mountains. Activity as compiled from Lorain (1937), Pardee and Schrader (1933) and McClernan (1983) is summarized below:

- 1899 Columbia Gold Mining and Milling Company developed the mine and built a mill.
- 1902-The mill was destroyed by fire.
- 1913—York Mining Company constructed another mill on the property.
- 1927—The total recorded production (to date) from the Golden Messenger was about 34,000 tons of \$6-\$7 (.2 to .3) per ton ore.
- 1927-28—Approximately 2,000 feet of development work was done by the Golden Messenger Corporation, but the mill did not operate.
- 1934 The mill was renovated.
- 1935-36—The mine was operated at a rate of about 125 tons/day.
- 1939 Seventy men were employed on the property.
- 1939-42—During this period, 309,936 tons of ore were produced and milled, yielding \$1,801,956 in revenue from mint shipments for an average recovery of \$5.91 per ton.
- 1942 Mine was closed.
- 1960-83—Property was explored by several mining companies.

All of the sources used to compile the history of the Golden Messenger and the placer deposits refer to total dollar value of the gold produced. Relating these figures to ounce-per-ton or ounce-per-yard is difficult because the authors did not define the production in terms of value when produced. The variation in price of gold per troy ounce is indicated below:

1899-1931 \$20.67 1931-1942 \$35.00

Geology

Bedrock in the Big Belt Mountains is composed of rocks equivalent to the Prichard Formation and Ravalli Group of the Belt Supergroup (Precambrian) (Harrison, 1972), overlain by Paleozoic and Mesozoic units (Sheet 2, back pocket). These rocks were intruded by younger igneous rocks and folded and faulted. Time relationships between

faulting and intrusion have not yet been firmly established. Geologic maps of the range or parts of it were prepared by Pardee and Schrader (1933), Johnson (1973), Birkholz (1967), Shaffer (1971), Gualtieri (1975), Nelson (1963), McClernan (in preparation), McClernan (1980), Woodward (1982), and Mertie, Fischer and Hobbs (1951).

The Newland Limestone of the Belt Supergroup of Precambrian age is the oldest formation in the range. This unit consists largely of gray argillite and siltite with some limestone and quartzite. Conformably overlying the Newland is the Greyson Shale, also a formation within the Belt Supergroup. The Greyson Shale consists predominantly of black and gray shale and argillite. The Spokane Formation conformably overlies the Greyson and consists predominantly of red shale and argillite. Overlying the Spokane is the Empire Formation, which marks the top of the Belt Supergroup in this part of the State. A regional unconformity separates the Precambrian from Paleozoic and Mesozoic units. Tertiary and Quaternary alluvium fill both the Helena-Townsend valley on the west and the Smith River Valley to the east.

Probably the oldest igneous rocks in the range are sills described as quartz diorite by Pardee and Schrader (1933). Because these bodies are confined to the Newland Limestone, they are generally regarded as Precambrian although they have not been radiometrically dated. Stocks and plugs exposed along and near the crest of the range have been considered to be Cretaceous to Tertiary age and were described as quartz monzonite by Pardee and Schrader (1933) and as tonalite by Johnson (1973). Numerous felsic dikes and plugs occur predominantly along the east side of the range. These include andesite, latite, and rhyolite (Birkholz, 1967).

The Big Belt Mountains in general are the result of an anticlinal flexure and high-angle, dip-slip faulting along the west side of the range. Some high-angle faulting also was described in the White Sulphur Springs Valley (Reynolds, 1979), but it does not appear to have major geomorphic influence. Principal structural elements in the range are the numerous thrust faults; some occur totally within Precambrian rocks, and some involve younger rocks (Sheet 2, back pocket). Although displacement is considered to be major along these faults, specific offset determinations await more detailed mapping.

Mineral deposits

Gold from both placer and lode deposits accounted for most of the production from the range, but copper was produced from the Argo mine in Hellgate Gulch, and sapphires are still being produced from the Missouri River bars and some of the gulches on the west side of the range. The most significant lode mine in terms of total production is the Golden Messenger. Most lode mines occur on the west side of the range although the Snowbank mine east of the divide was the only operation active in 1983. With the exception of the Golden Messenger deposit (described below), the lode deposits consist of narrow, quartz-filled fractures in igneous rocks and along bedding planes in sedimentary rocks. In most of the deposits, ore occurred within 50 to 100 feet of the surface. The primary ore consists of auriferous pyrite, but with relatively deep oxidation in the area, most of the ore mined consisted of a mixture of native gold with limonite.




Figure 2—Cross section of the Golden Messenger mine vein system (from Lorain, 1937).

The Golden Messenger deposit is the only one in the area that was studied and described in detail. It was open and accessible in 1928 when Pardee studied the area (Pardee and Schrader, 1933) and again in 1937 when Lorain (1937) described the min-

ing methods. Mineral deposits in the Miller Gulch-Confederate Gulch area were studied by Johnson (1973), but most of the deposits were inaccessible. The Golden Messenger deposit was described as a ladder-vein system in which a number of parallel veins cut through a dike and abruptly terminate at the contacts. The orebodies also terminate at the dike contacts although their enclosing faults seem to continue into the Greyson Shale (argillite). Most of the veins are in this system, striking northward and dipping westward, although a few trend at right angles to the others and dip northward. The veins consist essentially of soft limonite mixtures with gold in quartz and range in thickness from stringers only inches thick to 30 feet thick. They usually extend 200 to 300 feet both along strike and down dip. Several writers credit the deposit with an average production of \$6 to \$7 per ton. The primary mineral assemblage, in addition to quartz, contains pyrite in graphic intergrowth with hematite and a small amount of galena and sphalerite. Some ankerite is also present. Vein contacts with the diorite host rock are usually well defined although a few veins have gradational contacts. The orebodies within the veins are generally indefinite and structureless. Post-mineralization faulting has offset the orebodies though the amount of offset is minor (Figure 2).

Future potential and exploration possibilities

The source of the placer gold in the Big Belt Mountains presents an enigma. Confederate Gulch was one of the richest placer deposits in the early days of mining in Montana, and yet no large, rich lode sources for the gold have been identified. Some lodes have been found near the headwaters of Confederate Gulch (Johnson, 1973), but these appear to be small and do not have a significant record of production nor does the size of the workings suggest any large-scale production. On the other hand, the largest lode deposit in the range, the Golden Messenger, lies within a drainage that yielded only modest placer production.

Johnson (1973) described two types of lode deposits in the Confederate Gulch-White Gulch area—contact metamorphic and vein deposits within Tertiary-Cretaceous igneous bodies. The contact metamorphic deposits were defined on the basis of dump samples and communication with miners familiar with the mines. The veins in the igneous rocks were described on the basis of field examination. In addition, the ladder-vein system was observed and defined within the Golden Messenger mine. A narrow gold-quartz vein cutting bedding was also observed in the Snowbank mine east of the divide (McClernan, in preparation). Johnson (1973) concluded that the lode gold in the Confederate Gulch-White Gulch area is either magmatic gold, in the strict sense, or was derived from assimilated upper-crustal material. This conclusion would also apply to the Golden Messenger veins simply because they are restricted to positions within the diorite dike. It would also require that two ages of lode deposits exist, if the dikes are Precambrian as is generally accepted. Thus the Golden Messenger deposits would be Precambrian, and the Confederate Gulch lodes would be Cretaceous-Tertiary.

Very little detailed geologic work has been published on the Big Belt Mountains; consequently little evidence supporting or refuting Johnson's hypotheses is available. It is known only that the area produced a sizable amount of placer gold, including some from east of the divide where there is no obvious bedrock source. The same situation exists on the west slope of the mountains except that a larger number of lode deposits have been identified. It can be accepted, as a working model, that two ages of lode

deposits exist. Even if the Golden Messenger dike is of similar age to granitic stocks in the upper part of Confederate Gulch, most geologists would agree that two different magmatic systems are responsible for these rocks. The conclusion is that for some reason the earth's crust in the vicinity of the Big Belt Mountains contains anomalous amounts of gold. Presently no data conclusively support one particular argument or another as to why this anomalous concentration exists in this area. In order to test several alternative hypotheses, the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology is presently mapping and evaluating portions of the mountains.

The basic premise of the Bureau project is that the Belt Supergroup rocks of the Big Belt Mountains contain anomalous gold concentrations and that some of this gold has been remobilized during intrusion of diorite dikes and during intrusion of Tertiary-Cretaceous granitic bodies. The gold was mobilized probably by geothermal convection systems caused by intrusives and came to rest as veins within the igneous rocks. The immediate source of gold available to the intrusives is probably from within the Newland Limestone because this is the only commonality shared by all the lode deposits. If the Newland is the source, one or more zones within this unit could be the specific source. Identifying whether the Newland Limestone is the source of the gold is the immediate task; the next is determining the reason for its existence within the unit. A mechanism was defined by Pretorius (1976) for the Witwatersrand gold deposits of South Africa that may be applicable to the Big Belt Mountains. The mechanism requires a fluvial system that brought both coarse sediments and gold into an elongated basin. Algal mats floating farther basinward from the site of deposition of the clastics are responsible for trapping and collecting gold. The mechanism also requires a longitudinal fault peripheral to the basin and, obviously, a source for the gold within the fluvial system. In applying this mechanism to the Big Belt Mountains, the correlative situation is that in which the Newland Limestone was deposited in the Helena embayment of the Belt basin at about the same time that the LaHood Formation, a coarse clastic unit, was being deposited by a fluvial system emanating into the basin from Precambrian highlands to the south. The longitudinal fault in this instance is the Willow Creek fault. Fossil remains attributable to algal growth were identified by a number of writers including Birkholz (1967), and Pre-Belt crystalline rocks south of the Willow Creek fault are known to contain gold deposits of uncertain age.

If this mechanism is applicable to the Big Belt Mountains, one of the implications that bears on the future mineral potential of the area is that the gold in the Newland Limestone may be in economically exploitable deposits. Testing this hypothesis is the ultimate aim of the Bureau project.

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
