INTRODUCTION

To keep abreast of the mining activity in Montana during 1960, the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology has once again compiled this list of known mining enterprises active during 1960. Those of you who received previous listings for the years 1953 through 1957 will note a change in the arrangement of listings. The mines are listed alphabetically under counties and the location by section, township, range, and mining district has been given for those mines whose exact location is known to us. A map of Montana showing the different mining districts is included which will facilitate finding the area of a mine location.

Every possible effort has been made to have the information exact and complete. The inclusion of a property in the directory, however, is in no sense an endorsement of it, and responsibility for statements made rests with the person who furnished the data, and not with the Bureau of Mines and Geology. Correspondingly, omission of a property is not to be construed as a reflection on the merits of the property itself. Such omissions as occur are traceable to the failure of the last known operator to respond to repeated requests for necessary information. Nevertheless, in almost all such cases the missing data has been supplied from the most reliable sources available.

A special list of companies, which are inactive, idle, or dormant, has been added. Needless to say, it would be impossible to list all such companies in Montana. Therefore, in this bulletin the list will include only those companies that have not returned our questionnaires. Hereafter, all companies inactive for three or more years will be placed on this special list.

If any of you can provide us with the necessary additional information, or note a change in status of a mine, please forward such information. We strive to keep this yearly publication as up to date as possible, but we need your help.

The abbreviations used throughout this directory are as follows: sec. - section; T. - township; R. - range; t/d - tons per day.

THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF MONTANA IN 1960

Preliminary Annual Report

Mineral production in Montana totaled \$185.0 million in value in 1960, according to a preliminary report by the Bureau of Mines, U. S. Department of the Interior. This was a \$17.1-million increase over the strike-reduced total for 1959. The gain reversed a 3-year decline in the annual mineral production value for the State. The 1960 total value was the third highest on record (exceeded only in 1956 and 1957). Production of copper gained over the previous year due to settlement on February 16, 1960, of the 6-month strike at the Butte mines. This was more than enough to offset lower lead and zinc production resulting from poor market conditions and a strike at the Jack Waite mine.

Production of several nonmetals increased, including fluorspar, gypsum, lime, mica, phosphate rock, and pyrite. Output of barite, cement, sand and gravel, stone, and talc declined.

Estimated recovery of crude oil, the State's leading mineral product in value of output, was about the same as in 1959. Marketed production of natural gas increased in 1960.

Two new phosphate rock mines were being developed. A mechanical planer devised by the Bureau of Mines for underground phosphate mining was to be used at one of the mines with production scheduled to begin in 1961. Another development in the mineral industries was construction on a 190-mile petroleum pipeline from Glendive, Mont., to Minot, N. Dak. In 1961 a crude oil pipeline was to cross the State from the Cut Bank oil field to the Wyoming State line south of Billings.

The Anaconda Co. began an \$11 million, 5-year program to bring high-grade copper ore reserves into production from deep levels. The company also planned a \$6 million program for improving and enlarging the Anaconda Reduction Works.

General. Five major construction projects were to get under way in Montana in 1961, according to the State Employment Service. Included were three dams, Yellowtail at Hardin, Clark Canyon at Dillon, and Libby at Libby. Missile bases near Great Falls and Lewistown, and a steel mill on a 160-acre site at Anaconda also were to be constructed.

Employment at the Butte mines was far below the pre-strike figure but showed an upward trend. Average monthly employment in the oil fields and in the construction industry was less than in 1959. Completion of some military and public works projects caused the drop in construction employment.

Immediate construction of the Libby Dam on the Kootenai River in northwestern Montana would be feasible under a basic agreement reached by delegations representing the Governments of the United States and Canada. The agreement, if incorporated into a treaty, would make possible the cooperative development of the upper Columbia River and its tributaries for power, flood control, and other benefits. The Libby Dam would form a reservoir extending across the boundary into Canada.

REVIEW BY MINERAL COMMODITIES

METALS

Aluminum. - Production at the Anaconda Aluminum Co. Columbia Falls reduction plant remained at 87.5 percent of capacity throughout the year. Over 530 persons were employed at the plant in November when an average wage increase of 7.5 cents an hour went into effect. The new wage boost brought the plant minimum wage to \$2.33 an hour.

Chromium. - Output of chromite concentrate by American Chrome Co. from the Mouat mine and mill at Nye was 106,478 tons, a slight increase (less than 1 percent) over 1959. The tonnage was delivered entirely to a nearby stockpile under a Government contract that was to be completed in 1961. The mill supplied a small quantity of concentrate to an adjacent pilot smelting operation for the production of various grades of high- and medium-carbon ferrochromium; bulk alloy shipments were made by railroad in 9-ton steel containers to eastern steel companies.

Copper. - Return in February of The Anaconda Co. copper concentrator to production, after the prolonged 1959 strike, raised copper output 41 percent to 93,190 tons, compared with 65,911 tons in 1959. The Anaconda Butte-area mines accounted for over 99 percent of the State total.

A major development was an announcement by The Anaconda Co. of an \$11 million, 5-year program to tap high-grade copper ore reserves at deep levels. Additionally, the company announced a \$6 million replacement and modernization program at the Anaconda Reduction Works.

Gold. - Gold production reached 45,840 ounces, a 61-percent increase over the 28,551 ounces in 1959. Miscellaneous shipments to The Anaconda Co. accounted for a large portion of the total output. The Anaconda Co. mining and smelting operations showed an increase of gold from copper ore; gold recovered from zinc ore decreased.

Iron Ore. - Two companies produced 52,380 long tons of iron ore, 5 percent more than the 50,081 long ton 1959 output. Magnetite from the Iron Cross property (Ralls & Harris Bros.) near Radersburg was used in manufacturing cement. The Willow Creek mine (Young-Montana Corp.) near Stanford yielded magnetite for shipment to Cleveland Cliffs Iron Co., Superior, Wis., and numerous other companies in the Pacific Northwest and Canada.

Lead. - Lead output was 4,860 tons, a sharp decline of 37 percent from 1959. The decrease was due to curtailed production of lead-bearing zinc ore by The Anaconda Co. Anaconda zinc concentrator operations were not resumed until April, following the late-1959 strike settlement; the plant again was closed in September for the remainder of the year because of what the company termed a "slow zinc market." Also contributing to the State production drop was a 7-month-long strike at the American Smelting and Refining Co. Jack Waite mine.

Manganese. - Output from three company operations -- The Anaconda Co., Trout Mining Co., and Taylor-Knapp Co. -- was above the 21,604 tons produced in 1959.

<u>Silver.</u> - Approximately 80 percent of the State production (3,462,820 ounces) was yielded by mines of The Anaconda Co. Output was about the same as 1959, increasing 1 percent principally because of greater production at the Anaconda copper concentrator that just offset a decrease at the zinc concentrator.

Steel.- Webb & Knapp, Inc., was still contemplating the construction of an integrated steel plant at Anaconda. The proposed 350,000-ton-annual capacity plant would utilize iron-bearing slag from the Anaconda Reduction Works. A contract was signed during the year with the Bonneville Power Administration for a total of 150,000 kw. of firm and interruptible low-cost Federal power. Shipment of 750 tons of slag was made to Strategic-Udy Metallurgical & Chemical Process, Ltd., at Niagara Falls, Ont., for large-scale testing in a prototype of the plant to be erected at Anaconda.

Thorium. - There was no production of thorite during the year.

Tungsten. - Minerals Engineering Co. mined tungsten ore the entire year from the Calvert mine near Wise River, Beaverhead County. The ore was trucked to a company mill at Glen for concentrating; the concentrate was marketed under contract to an eastern firm.

<u>Uranium.</u> - The tonnage of ore mined was less than in 1959, but the production value remained substantially the same.

Zinc. - Total output was 11,800 tons compared with 27,848 tons in 1959, a decrease of 58 percent. The Anaconda Co. zinc-fuming plant at East Helena accounted for a major portion of the State total. The company zinc concentrator at Anaconda, normally the largest producer, had no production until April following the 1959 strike. In September, the zinc concentrator was closed because of a company view toward the zinc market and the fact that stocks of slab zinc at the company's Anaconda and Great Falls reduction plants were ample to meet demand.

Development work was conducted during the year on the Anaconda Black Rock-Elm Orlu low-grade-zinc block-caving project; the company planned to begin production in 1961.

NONMETALS

<u>Barite</u>. - Output of barite was considerably less than in 1959. Baroid Sales Division, National Lead Co., mined and ground the mineral at Greenough, Missoula County.

Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology announced discovery of barite mineralization on the west flank of Tobacco River Valley 5 miles southwest of Eureka, Lincoln County. This discovery was incidental to a survey of mineral resources in northwestern Montana sponsored jointly by the State bureau, the Great Northern Railway, and the Pacific Power & Light Co.

<u>Cement.</u> There was a sizeable decrease indicated in the quantity and value of cement shipments compared with 1959. The Trident plant of Ideal Cement Co., Montana Division, continued to be the only producer of cement in the State.

Clays. - The quantity of clays sold or used by producers in Montana declined an estimated 11 percent from 1959. Cessation of bentonite production at the National Lead Co. Alzada pit in Carter County was the principal reason for the decline; lower output of miscellaneous clay (includes expansible shale) also contributed. Miscellaneous clay used for making heavy clay products was produced in Fergus, Powell, and Yellowstone Counties, and shale for making expanded lightweight aggregate was dug in Cascade and Yellowstone Counties. Fire clay was produced from the Armington mine in Cascade County.

The Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology in January published a report of clay and shale resources in the State.

<u>Fluorspar</u>. - Shipments of fluorspar by Cummings-Roberts, Darby, Ravalli County, rose sharply compared with 1960. The steel industry was the major consumer. Crude fluorspar mined at the Crystal Mountain pit was trucked to the Darby plant for processing.

Gypsum. - A small increase in output of gypsum compared with 1959 was accompanied by a decrease in value of the same order. Fergus County was the source with U. S. Gypsum Co. (Shoemaker mine) and Ideal Cement Co. (Hanover mine) contributing to the production. As in past years, most of the output was calcined and marketed as ground gypsum, wallboard, and lath.

<u>Lime</u>. - Production of lime increased 34 and 25 percent, respectively, in quantity and value compared with 1959, returning to the level of 1958. Quicklime was made by The Anaconda Co. (Deer Lodge County) and by Elliston Lime Co. (Powell County). Some hydrated lime was marketed by the latter company.

Mica. - Three operations contributed to a fivefold increase in the quantity of mica shipped to the Government purchase depot at Custer, S. Dak., compared with 1959. The bulk of the output came from the Thumper No. 1

mine (Planet Exploration Co.) near Gallatin Gateway, Gallatin County. Two other operations—the Sparkle mine, 11 miles southeast of Dillon, Beaverhead County, and the Merlin mine, 12 miles south of Ennis, Madison County—also shipped.

Phosphate Rock. - Quantity and value of marketable phosphate rock produced were 12 percent higher than 1959. Rock from operations in Beaverhead, Powell, and Silver Bow Counties was converted to elemental phosphorus, phosphoric acid, and phosphate fertilizers. Most of the output from Powell County was exported to British Columbia.

Phosphate rock from Conda, Idaho, was processed by Rocky Mountain Phosphates, Inc., using facilities at the old Domestic Manganese & Development Co. plant at Butte. A defluorinated phosphate product for use as animal food supplement was made, using chemicals from The Anaconda Co. operations.

The Bunker Hill Co. continued work at the Jack Pine phosphate-rock prospect near Elliston. Development consisted of driving two tunnels and road building.

Encouraged by adaptation of the Bureau of Mines mechanical planer to phosphate mining, Montana Phosphate Products Co. started work at a mine near Maxville designed specifically for use of the planer. Mining was scheduled to begin next year on beds 5-7 feet thick that dip 30-60 degrees. The planer was described in a Bureau of Mines Report of Investigations No. 5437, 1959.

Pyrite. - There was a substantial increase in the quantity of pyrite converted to sulfuric acid by The Anaconda Co. Processing Silver Bow County base-metal ores provided the pyrite product. The acid produced was used at the company chemical-fertilizer plant and at the metallurgical works.

Sand and Gravel and Stone. - Combined output of these commodities totaled 11.7 million tons valued at \$13.7 million. This was somewhat less than the corresponding figures--12.1 million tons and \$14.3 million--for 1959.

Multi-Mineral Products Co. began quarrying dolomitic and high-purity limestone from a deposit near Red Lodge. A crushing plant was completed at midyear. The mixed carbonate was marketed for agricultural purposes.

Building and decorative stone was produced at a new quarry near Thompson Falls.

<u>Sulfur.</u> Waste gases from two oil refineries at Billings were converted to high-purity elemental sulfur by Montana Sulphur & Chemical Co. Hydrogen sulfide gas was transported from the Continental Oil Co. refinery through a 4-mile pipeline. The other source was the nearby Humble Oil & Refining Co. refinery. Most of the output was used by an Idaho chemical-fertilizer manufacturer.

Talc. - There was a slight decline in the tonnage and value of talc mined compared with 1959. Sierra Talc Co. (Yellowstone and Beaverhead mines) and Tri-State Minerals Co. (Smith-Dillon, Regal, and Treasure State mines) were the principal producers.

Vermiculite. Output of crude vermiculite by Zonolite Co. was about the same as 1959. The company open pit near Libby, Lincoln County, continued to be the major source of this commodity in the Nation. A program was initiated to study ways of beneficiating the low-grade material from the mine and to develop new products. Masonry-fill water-repellant insulation and fire-proofing material, new products, showed promise.

MINERAL FUELS

<u>Coal</u>.- Production of bituminous coal and lignite was about 293,000 tons compared with 345,000 tons in 1959. Lignite was mined to supply requirements of Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. steam-electric generating plant at Sidney, Richland County.

Petroleum and Natural Gas. - Estimated recovery of crude oil was about the same as in 1959. Marketed production of natural gas rose to 32.3 billion cubic feet (\$2.6 million) compared with 30.7 billion cubic feet (\$2.3 million) in 1959.

Crude oil production from fields in central Montana nearly doubled in the last year and a half due mainly to increasing recovery from the Stensvad field, brought into production in 1958, and to continued expansion of the Sumatra and Ivanhoe fields. Montana ranked twelfth in the Nation as a liquid petroleum source and fourteenth in proved reserves.

One of the most significant wildcat wells drilled in Montana in recent years was brought in by T. E. Murphy Corp., 13 miles northeast of Wolf Point, Roosevelt County. The test flow was 87.1 barrels an hour through a 7/16-inch choke. To date the well was the westernmost in the Williston Basin yielding crude oil from a Devonian horizon. Another wildcat well (No. 1-V Kesterson) drilled by Sinclair Oil & Gas Co. 10 miles southeast of the main portion of the Sumatra field in Rosebud County showed promise of a new producing area. This was the first drilling activity in the immediate vicinity.

Construction of a 190-mile pipeline from Glendive, Mont., to Minot, N. Dak., was begun by Farmers Union Central Exchange of South St. Paul, Minn. This would be an extension of the line the company has from Laurel to Glendive. Announcement was made of a proposed crude-oil pipeline to be completed by mid-1961 from fields near Cut Bank to the Wyoming State line south of Billings. At the southern end the pipeline would connect with other lines to transport crude oil to Midwestern cities.

The Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology published Bulletin 15, "Oil and Gas in Montana," early in the year.

This report summarizes mineral industry activity in Montana in 1960 and contains preliminary production data for the year as estimated from company monthly and quarterly production canvasses, smelter and Government purchase depot receipt reports, and information contained in industry publications. Final production totals for the State's mineral commodities will be published in mid-1961 after completion of canvasses of all mineral industry establishments.
