INTRODUCTION

To keep abreast of the mining activity in Montana during 1961, the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology has once again compiled this list of known mining enterprises active during 1961. Those of you who received previous listings for the years 1953 through 1957 will note a change in the arrangement of listings. The mines are listed alphabetically under counties and the location by section, township, range, and mining district has been given for those mines whose exact location is known to us. A map of Montana showing the different mining districts is included which will facilitate finding the area of a mine location.

Every possible effort has been made to have the information exact and complete. The inclusion of a property in the directory, however, is in no sense an endorsement of it, and responsibility for statements made rests with the person who furnished the data, and not with the Bureau of Mines and Geology. Correspondingly, omission of the property is not to be construed as a reflection on the merits of the property itself. Such omissions as occur are traceable to the failure of the last known operator to respond to repeated requests for necessary information. Nevertheless, in almost all such cases the missing data has been supplied from the most reliable sources available.

A special list of companies, which are inactive, idle, or dormant, has been added. Needless to say, it would be impossible to list all such companies in Montana. Therefore, in this bulletin the list will include those companies that have not returned our questionnaires or companies inactive for three or more years.

If any of you can provide us with the necessary additional information, or note a change in status of a mine, please forward such information. We strive to keep this yearly publication as up to date as possible, but we need your help.

STATE COAL MINE INSPECTOR'S REPORT

Coal production in the State of Montana for the fiscal year June 30, 1960 to June 30, 1961 with 46 mines reporting was 352,924 tons as compared with 335,121 tons for the previous year, an increase of 17,803 tons.

There were no fatalities in the Montana coal mines during the preceding year. There were 29 reportable injuries with 9 lost time injuries. The only serious accidents resulting in injuries were due to roof falls, which continues to be the number one hazard in the coal mines.

During the past year several more of the smaller mines, owned and operated by ranchers, were closed down and it is doubtful if they will reopen. The winter of 1960 and 1961 was very mild and this curtailed the demand for coal.

The Square Deal Co. and Johnie's mine have installed new air shafts which will improve their ventilation and give the employees an additional escapeway. A new drift has been driven in the Burns mine connecting the live workings to the outside which provides better ventilation and gives this mine two escapeways.

There were two applicants for the mine foremans examination with one certificate being issued. When the steel mill is constructed in Anaconda the demand for coal will increase and improve the economic conditions in the coal fields.

THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF MONTANA IN 1961

Preliminary Annual Report

Montana's copper production in 1961 was the largest in 17 years. Red metal output increased to 104,000 tons. In contrast, there was a further decrease in lead and zinc production in the State. Montana mines produced only 3,000 tons of lead (lowest recorded since 1932) and 11,000 tons of zinc (lowest since 1938). Mineral fuels activity was highlighted by a record output of crude petroleum of 31 million barrels. Crude petroleum (\$74.9 million) and copper (\$62.3 million) supplied 75 percent of the value of mineral production during the year. According to preliminary figures, increased production was recorded for natural gas, coal, sand and gravel, stone, cement, lime, vermiculite, and tungsten ore and concentrate. Production of the following commodities declined: chromium ore and concentrate, gold, manganese ore and concentrate, silver, fluorspar, and phosphate rock. The State total value of mineral production of \$182.0 million was \$3.2 million (2 percent) greater than in 1960, according to a preliminary report by the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. The value was considerably below the record production of \$214 million in 1956.

<u>General.</u> - The index of the quantity of production based on preliminary figures was 123 compared with 114 in 1960 (1959 = 100). The index was a weighted average of the quantities produced in 1961 divided by those produced in 1959, using current year values as weights.

State legislation was passed concerning eminent domain in the acquisition of surface property for mining. Condemnation and appraisal procedures were about the same as used for highways; property owners were to be paid the value of similar residential property in a similar area not affected by open-pit mining. The new law was considered necessary to extend the boundaries of existing open-pit operations at Butte as well as to begin any new open-pit mining in the future in the Butte area.

Construction of the Libby Dam on the Kootenai River in northwestern Montana was made possible under a treaty between the United States and Canada signed by the President and the Prime Minister in January. The treaty was ratified quickly by the U.S. Senate, but approval by the Canadian Parliament was held up because of a disagreement between the Federal Government of Canada and the Provincial Government of British Columbia over means of financing three storage dams to be constructed in southeastern British Columbia. The treaty provided for cooperative development of the water resources of the Columbia Basin. Both the Columbia and the Kootenai are international streams. Benefits for power and flood control would result from construction made possible by the treaty. Expansion of industry such as aluminum reduction would be likely from new blocks of power that would become available.

State economic trends were disclosed by employment statistics published by the Montana Employment Service. Based on figures for the first 10 months, mining industry employment averaged the same as in 1960; however, in 1960 the trend was upward following settlement of a metal-mining labor dispute in February, while in 1961 the trend was downward due to poor metal markets and mine closures. Manufacturing employment declined slightly (2 percent) as the result of cutbacks early in the year in lumber and timber products, primary metals, and petroleum refining. Contract construction recorded the largest gain among the State's industries and increased 16 percent over 1960. Highway projects, missile-site construction, and preliminary work on two dams provided impetus. Average employment for all non-agricultural industries increased 1 percent.

The Anaconda Co. process-metallurgy research center at Anaconda employed 37 technical personnel in the following areas of research: the utilization of Berkeley pit (company mine at Butte) ore waste as an alumina source; application of the electric furnace in copper smelting and refining; metallurgical techniques for fluidized-bed-reactor roasting of ore concentrates; production of industrial chemicals from Montana raw materials; mineral dressing, leaching, and flotation studies on molybdenum from copper ore and concentrate, on beryl ores, on Canadian magnetite (iron) ores, and on South American base-metal ores; and the application of instrumentation to process control.

REVIEW BY MINERAL COMMODITIES

METALS

Aluminum. - Anaconda Aluminum Co., Columbia Falls, primary aluminum output was increased to full capacity (approximately 65,000 tons annually) on May 1; the increase brought 30 idle reduction cells into production. Toward yearend the company announced that a feasibility study was being conducted that might result in expansion of the Columbia Falls plant to 3 potlines, an addition of 1 line to the existing 2. Anaconda Aluminum produced more fabricated than primary aluminum--primary expansion could correct the imbalance and permit the company to halt purchases from competitors.

Chromium. The American Chrome Co. Stillwater County mining and milling operation at Nye ceased production following completion of a 900,000-ton Government stockpiling contract. The mine was closed on September 29 and the mill on October 2. Ore was broken at the mine during the first 4 months of the year and hauled from these reserves for the remaining 5 months of the operation. The 3, 4, and 5 levels were worked in the G and H zones of the deposit (classification described in Geological Survey Bulletins 922-N, 948-C, and 1015-D) and no development was carried out. Approximately 100 workers were terminated because of the closure. Measured, indicated, and inferred reserves remaining in the deposit totaled in excess of 4 million tons, and a potential of an additional 5 million tons was estimated to be available through further exploration and development.

A pilot smelter operated by American Chrome at the mill site also was shut down on October 12. Medium-carbon ferrochromium was produced from the Mouat ore concentrate and marketed to eastern United States stainless steel producers. A rotating-disc pelletizer was installed in the pilot-smelter charge-preparation room earlier in the year; its purpose was to prepare a pellet composed of reductant, flux, and chromite concentrate for charging to the electric smelting furnace. The company was attempting to acquire a Federal contract to smelt the nearby 900,000-ton stockpile to ferrochromium.

Copper. - All but 247 tons of the 103,840-ton State total (a 13-percent increase over 1960) was yielded from The Anaconda Co. Berkeley pit, Kelley, and vein-ore mines at Butte, Silver Bow County. A shaft development program was underway at the Anaconda Butte mines as part of a comprehensive move to increase production efficiency, and to explore and prepare deeper levels for

mining: The Steward sub-shaft was sunk and concreted 662 feet below the 4000 level; sinking of the Kelley No. 1 shaft below the 3000 level was begun in May; and plans were being made to extend the Neversweat shaft from the 2800-level to the 4500-level horizon to provide adequate ventilation for the deeper levels.

The Butte mines yielded approximately 43,000 tons of ore a day--33,000 from the Berkeley pit, 8,000 from the Kelley, and 2,000 from high-grade vein ore. Mill heads from the Berkeley pit contained from 0.70 to 0.78 percent copper.

The Anaconda Reduction Works at Anaconda, Deer Lodge County, employed approximately 2,200 at yearend; nearly 1,000 workers were laid off during the year because of terminations of zinc and phosphate fertilizer production. Fluidized-bed roasting of copper concentrate was initiated in November, replacing hearth roasting, and the capacity of two reverberatory furnaces was doubled by widening the furnace shells. Copper output was at the reduction works capacity of 25-million pounds a month. An expansive 4,000-acre tailings pond was in use, adjacent to the Anaconda plant; mill tails were used in dike building to contain the slimes.

Gold. - Output declined 26 percent to a total of 34,120 ounces, yielded principally from copper ores of The Anaconda Co. and gold-bearing ores and concentrates received at the Anaconda Reduction Works from miscellaneous shippers.

Iron Ore. - Young-Montana Corp. terminated work at the Willow Creek mine near Stanford; ore shipments were below previous years and accounted for a decline in the State total. Although considerable ore remained at the Willow Creek property, costs became excessive because of the necessity to mine selectively around high-sulfur-bearing ore, that was encountered in greater quantities. Ralls & Harris Bros., Radersburg, shipped from the Iron Cross mine and from several claims about 5 miles west of Radersburg.

<u>Lead</u>.- Preliminary estimates indicated a 40-percent production decline to 2,910 tons compared with 4,879 for the previous year. Miscellaneous shippers to the American Smelting and Refining Co. (Asarco) lead smelter at East Helena and the Asarco Jack Waite mine, Sanders County, accounted for most of the total. The Jack Waite property was closed in March, and Asarco terminated its long-term lease with the Jack Waite Mining Co.

Manganese. Total output from three company operations -- The Anaconda Co., Trout Mining Co., and Taylor-Knapp Co.--declined. The Anaconda Co. shipped from stocks most of the year, but produced manganese nodules during 2 months in the fall; the ore treated had been mined previously and stockpiled at the idle Emma mine. The Trout company entered into a cooperative contract with the nearby Taylor-Knapp Co., whereby Trout shipped manganese ore to the Taylor-Knapp mill for processing, and in return, Trout beneficiated base-metal ore from Taylor-Knapp mines.

A diversity of manganese products were shipped by Taylor-Knapp: A 50-55 percent MnO_2 product went to the uranium-processing industry; battery grade ore was shipped for flashlight-battery manufacture; low-grade ore was used as a cell cleaner at base-metal refineries; carbonate ore was used in manufacturing welding rod; and a new oxide ore use was as a coloring agent in clay-brick products.

Silver. - Production was 3,335,730 ounces, a drop of 8 percent from a total of 3,606,991 ounces for the previous year. The Anaconda Co. Butte copper mines and miscellaneous shippers to the American Smelting and Refining Co. East Helena lead smelter accounted for most of the total.

In December the Government announced cessation of silver sales. The full impact of this action on the price of silver and on the domestic silver producer remained to be determined.

Steel.- Gulf State Lands and Industries, Inc., a subsidiary of Webb and Knapp, Inc., applied to the Federal Area Redevelopment Administration (ARA) for financial assistance to construct a proposed steel plant at Anaconda, utilizing The Anaconda Co. smelter slag and Montana iron ore as raw materials. The estimated cost of plant construction was \$40 million. The ARA had not reached a decision at yearend on the request.

<u>Tungsten.</u> - Minerals Engineering Co. produced high-grade scheelite concentrate at a mill near Glen; ore was mined at the Calvert pit mine near Wise River. The pit reached a depth of 165 feet. Good results were obtained from a new upgrading process at the mill, and concentrate exceeding 70 percent WO₃ was produced from 60 percent WO₃ concentrate by using a hydrochloric acid leach. Total mine and mill employment was approximately 40 men.

<u>Uranium.</u> - Ore tonnage and value dropped compared with 1960. Lower-grade ore was mined, accounting for a greater decline in value.

Zinc. - Absence of zinc production by The Anaconda Co., except for a comparatively small tonnage yielded from manganese sulfide ore treated in September and October, was the principal factor accounting for an 11-percent decline to 11,110 tons, compared with 12,551 tons for the previous year. Anaconda company zinc mining at Butte ceased in 1960. The Anaconda Co. slag-fuming operation at East Helena was the largest single producer. All Anaconda zinc refining of purchased and toll concentrates was conducted at the Great Falls plant.

NONMETALS

Barite. - Output of barite increased compared with 1960, according to estimates. Baroid Sales Division, National Lead Co., continued to mine and grind barite near Greenough, Missoula County.

Plans were announced to resume barite mining at the Copper Mountain claims, 5 miles south of Troy in Lincoln County. Recent development by the owners (Lendal and Donald Kotschever) uncovered veins of high-grade barite.

<u>Cement.</u> - Quantity and value of cement shipments increased 9 percent and 13 percent, respectively, compared with last year. The Ideal Cement Co. plant at Trident, Gallatin County, continued to be the only cement producer in the State.

Permanente Cement Co. (Oakland, Calif.) indicated interest in constructing a \$10 million cement plant near Helena. The cement company was associated with a group holding the prime contract for constructing the Yellowtail Dam near Hardin. Cement requirements for the dam were estimated at 1 million barrels.

<u>Clays.-</u> Production of miscellaneous clay and fire clay was 4 percent less than 1960.

Miscellaneous clay (includes shale) was dug in Fergus, Powell, Cascade, and Yellowstone Counties. Cascade County also was the source of fire clay.

Bentonite that qualifies under the Agricultural Conservation Program was mined in southern Phillips County. Under this program, 50 percent of the cost of sealing stockwater and irrigation dams would be credited to the farmer or rancher.

A report "Preliminary Investigation of Clay Deposits in Minnesota, North Dakota, Montana, Northern Idaho, and Washington" prepared by Northern Pacific Railway Co. Geologic Division, Properties and Industrial Development Department, has been put on open file at the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology office.

<u>Fluorspar.</u> - Output of fluorspar from the Crystal Mountain mine was curtailed sharply by Cummings-Roberts. Mined ore was trucked to the Darby, Ravalli County, plant for processing.

Gypsum. - A small decrease in the quantity of crude gypsum mined was accompanied by a slight increase in value. Two mines in Fergus County furnished the output. As in past years, most of the production was calcined and marketed as ground gypsum, wallboard, and lath.

Mica. - A small increase in the quantity of mica shipped to the Government purchase depot at Custer, S. Dak., was accompanied by a sharp rise in value. Larger amounts of higher grade mica were shipped. Most of the production came from the Thumper No. 1 mine of Planet Exploration Co. near Gallatin Gateway, Gallatin County.

Phosphate Rock. - Output of marketable phosphate rock was slightly lower than 1960. Mines in Beaverhead, Powell, and Silver Bow Counties contributed to the production. Phosphate rock was processed to elemental phosphorus, phosphoric acid, and phosphate fertilizers.

The ammonium-phosphate plant of The Anaconda Co. was dismantled and shipped to J. R. Simplot Co. west of Pocatello, Idaho. The Idaho company purchased the plant and leased the Conda (Idaho) phosphate rock deposits from Anaconda last year.

The Bunker Hill Co. relinquished its lease on the Jack Pine phosphate claims near Elliston, Powell County. The company had been developing the property.

Phosphate rock from a deposit in the Hall-Maxville area of Granite County was shipped by Montana Phosphate Products Co. to Consolidated Smelting and Mining Company of Canada, Ltd., at Trail, British Columbia, for beneficiation testing. A plant would be built at the site, if the rock could be beneficiated economically and if a market could be developed.

Sand and Gravel and Stone. - Combined output of sand and gravel and stone totaled 14.3 million tons (\$14.2 million) compared with 13.8 million tons (\$13.2 million) in 1960. Montana had one of the biggest highway construction years in its history. Contracts for all heavy construction were more than \$14 million higher than in 1960; however, work was not started during the year on all projects. An increase in stone production resulted from larger quantities of limestone used for making cement and lime.

Sulfur. - Production and shipments of high-purity elemental sulfur were slightly less than in 1960. Waste refinery gases were processed at the Montana Sulphur & Chemical Co. plant in Yellowstone County.

Talc. - Estimated tonnage of talc output was 31 percent lower than in 1960. Production came from Beaverhead and Madison Counties.

Sierra Talc Co. opened a new talc-grinding plant at Three Forks, Gallatin County. Marketed under the trade name "Mistron Vapor," the product will be used by the paint, cosmetics, chemical, pulp and paper, and rubber industries. Ore from the Yellowstone mine is cleaned and screened on the site and then trucked to the new plant for grinding, packaging, and shipping.

American Chemet Corp. produced for the second year from the Madison mine in the Johnny Gulch area adjacent to Sierra Talc's Yellowstone open pit.

A publication of the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology listed a new talc deposit, 2,000 feet long and 800 feet wide, south of Ennis on Cherry Creek, Madison County.

<u>Vermiculite</u>. - Production of crude vermiculite from the Libby (Lincoln County) open-pit mine by Zonolite Co. was 11 percent greater than in 1960.

Use of vermiculite for masonry fill insulation and for concrete aggregate for roof deck applications, as well as for home garden, agriculture, and animal feed purposes increased. A highly refined fraction called "verxite" was supplied to Monsanto Chemical Co. for use in making a stock-feed product.

The Zonolite company embarked on a development program adjacent to the producing pit. Involved was stripping overburden from an area of about 30 acres. Milling ore for a few years to come would be obtained from this area.

MINERAL FUELS

<u>Coal</u>. - Estimated output of bituminous coal and lignite was 360,000 tons compared with 313,000 tons in 1960. The steam-electric generating plant at Sidney, Richland County, continued to be the main consumer of lignite.

Attention was called to a new refinery byproduct--"fluid coke." This finely divided carbon from the Humble Oil & Refining Co. refinery at Billings after being briquetted and crushed was tested as a reductant in various metallurgical processes--producing elemental phosphorus and smelting at East Helena.

Petroleum and Natural Gas. - Recovery of crude oil was estimated at 31.1 million barrels (\$74.9 million) compared with 30.2 million barrels (\$72.9 million) in 1960. Marketed production of natural gas rose to 34.0 billion cubic feet (\$2.6 million) from 33.4 billion cubic feet (\$2.4 million) in the previous year.

There was considerable drilling activity throughout the producing areas of the State. Concentrated effort was expended in the southwestern corner of the Williston Basin along the Cedar Creek anticline which traverses portions of Fallon, Prairie, and Wibaux Counties. Up to October, 43 of the 46 wells drilled yielded crude oil. Very little information was released but there was much activity in the Tule Creek area of Roosevelt County, about 15 miles northwest of the Poplar field. Interest began with a Nisku-Devonian strike in the 1 Sletvold. Numerous shows had been reported from this formation but no actual production in Montana. An important eastern extension of the Keg Coulee field (Musselshell County) was drilled and the Pennel field (Fallon County) had a three-horizon producer. There also was interest along the "disturbed belt" on the east front of the Rocky Mountains, looking for an extension of the gas fields of Alberta.

A major expansion program was started at the Phillips Petroleum Co. refinery at Great Falls. Included would be erection of a new catalytic cracking unit, a distillate hydrogenation unit, expansion and modernization of the laboratory facilities, and expansion of the refinery's water-cooling system. Farmers Union Central Exchange increased crude-charging and fresh-feed catalytic cracking capacity at its Laurel refinery. Texaco, Inc., announced plans to close its Cut Bank refinery. The company had operated the facility only intermittently since 1958. Because of the newly constructd Glacier pipeline, no problems were anticipated in marketing the crude produced in the area.

A 430-mile crude oil pipeline owned jointly by Continental Pipe Line Co. and Texas Pipe Line Co. was completed from fields in northern Montana near Cut Bank to Roundup and to refinery centers at Billings and Laurel. From here, it continued to Bryon in northern Wyoming where it connected with facilities of the Platte Pipeline Co.

This report summarizes mineral industry activity in Montana in 1961 and contains preliminary production data for the year as estimated from company monthly and quarterly production canvasses, smelter and Government purchase depot receipt reports, and information contained in industry publications. Final production totals for the State's mineral commodities will be published in mid-1962 after completion of canvasses of all mineral industry establishments.


